

VBH IN 2022

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When Tommy and Patty founded what would become Veterans Bridge Home in 2011, they did not embark on a journey to prevent Veterans suicide. What they did was set the foundation for what it meant to create a community that would ensure Veterans and their families thrived after their military service.

In the ensuing years, mental health experts have begun to understand that Veteran suicide is most strongly correlated to the loss of mission, unit and purpose that occurs when Veterans leave the military. This means that the model the Normans created to connect Veterans and their families with fulfilling careers, address their human service needs, and connect them with a network of friends is actually the work necessary to prevent the epidemic of Veteran suicide.

In 2019, the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs asked VBH to testify to how communities might assist the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs in helping lower the incidence of Veteran suicide. That testimony and other discussions with House and Senate staffers provided the baseline for what would become the SSG Parker Gordon Fox Suicide Prevention Grant. A grant that hundreds of organizations across the country applied for in 2022, and VBH was one of two in the state of North Carolina and one of 80 in the country to receive.

This grant marked a tremendous shift in the visibility of this organization. What had been one of the nation's first community-based organizations to practice a Veteran-focused collective impact model has grown into a nationally recognized organization that is replicating our model in five markets across the Carolinas. None of this growth and recent success would have been possible without your support.

We are grateful to have your support and look forward to continuing this journey together.




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

2022 HIGHLIGHTS



RETURN TO NORMAL

Prior to the pandemic, community engagement events were a mainstay of the VBH program.

These events connected newly arrived Veterans with established peers, forging vital social capital bonds. With the loosening of COVID-19 restrictions, VBH resumed hosting and attending events across the Carolinas to meet Veterans and help others connect to their community.



VETERANS AFFAIRS FUNDING

In September, VBH received a \$750,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs to counter Veteran Suicide.

The Staff Sergeant Parker Gordon Fox Suicide Prevention Grant supports community-based suicide prevention efforts through outreach, suicide prevention services, and connection to VA and community resources.



HERO RUN – RUN LIKE JAKE

In November, the annual Hero Run 5k was especially poignant as it was dedicated in memory of Veteran champion, Jake Miller.

Jake and his daughter Annaliese worked to help end Veteran homelessness and we recognized their efforts at the 2019 Hero Run. Jake's sudden death in 2022 shocked his family and friends. To honor Jake's life, Annaliese and her mother Margot raised more than \$75,000 at the race and attracted more runners than any previous year.

This year we ran like Jake.

CONNECTION TO EMPLOYMENT

In spring 2022, Veterans Bridge Home welcomed a new employment team. Laura Happer, an Army National Guard Veteran and Army spouse, supports employment in the Triangle and Triad regions. Reka Reyna, an Army spouse, assists in the Sandhills of NC and Midlands of SC. Aaron Harper, a Marine Veteran and Army spouse, handles employment requests in the Charlotte area and leads our collaboration efforts with employer partners.

Employment support was our second most requested service across our service area in 2022, making up approximately 12% of all requests. Some sought new careers while others desired better employment opportunities. To address this, VBH organized five career fairs statewide, attracting 6,659 service members, Veterans, and family members. We also worked closely with over a thousand employers to help them better understand how and why they should hire Veterans and their spouses.

STAR SPANGLED SALUTE


The 2022 Veterans Bridge Home Star Spangled Salute was a huge success!
